FASTING AND FEASTING---In preparation to celebrate the Dormition of the Theotokos on August 15, there is a two-week fast from August 1 through August 14. It is just the fast of Great Lent----strict Lenten fasting, wine & oil allowed on Saturdays & Sundays. On Transfiguration Day, August 6 fish is allowed.

August 29th, the Beheading of St. John the Baptist, is a very strict one-day fast.

OUR CHURCH FAMILY MEET-UP

Alice Marantides and her husband, Harry, have been with St. Matthew's for almost the entire history of our church. They even visited us when we were at the Tri-City Senior Citizen's Center in Middleburg Heights. However, it wasn't until 1992 before they decided to join us and raise their family here.

Alice was born on June 7, 1955, to Dick and Betty Oatman at the old Southwest General Hospital in Berea. Betty was a stay-at-home mother and Dick worked for Ohio Bell. Alice was the middle child of 7 girls. The family lived on Usher Road in Olmsted Falls. They attended the very liberal United Church of Christ. Alice's mother was a Christian and so there were prayers said at meals and at bedtime. Alice's father was not a church-goer. He would argue with his wife over the matter of life after death. He believed that when you die, you die. There was nothing afterward.

When Alice was 15, her dad was killed in a car-train accident on his way to work. After Dick had left for work and had been killed and before anyone knew this had happened, Alice's mother heard her husband say to her, "Betty, you were right."

Alice lists this accident as her #1 life trauma. She attributes some of her wild restlessness and out of control behavior over the next years as a result of this trauma.

After graduating from high school, Alice enrolled at Lutheran Medical Center Nursing School in Ohio City. She graduated in 1976 and became a nurse for the newly established Cuyahoga County Jail's psych unit. She met her future husband, Harry Marantides, there. At that time Harry was working there as a corrections officer. Harry and Alice started playing Scrabble together during break time at work. Eventually this led to their dating each other. Early on, Alice told Harry that she would not be unevenly yoked with him (referring to the Bible passage, 2 Corinthians 6:14, that says believers should not marry unbelievers). Well, this led Harry to start attending a Bible study at St. Paul's Orthodox Church. He was a baptized Orthodox as a baby, but was not raised to go to church much and hadn't made a commitment to Christ. They got married in 1978 in Alice's home UCC church, but continued attending Frank Chirakas' Bible Study at St. Paul's. A year later, Alice became Orthodox and she and Harry joined St. Paul's.

Alice had a brief struggle with infertility. She turned to the Theotokos to ask her intercession. Finally, they were blessed with Evangeline (Angie) in 1983, Andrew in 1985, and Katherine (Katie) in 1989.

Alice spent 40 years as a pediatric nurse. While her children were at home, she worked the week-end shift, avoiding the expense of needing babysitters. Harry spent those years in the life insurance business.

Throughout the years of her life, Alice's faith in God was always there, sometimes in a mild way and sometimes in a life-changing way. Her mother was a huge influence on her. Betty had left the UCC church and began attending Christ the King, known as a "spirit-filled church." This awakened Betty's faith and Alice reaped some of the blessings of her mother's changed life.

Alice loved her work as a nurse. She saw it as her ministry and felt honored that God chose her to help people, especially the sick children. Then after all of those years, health issues began to appear in her life. She had foot, back, neck and lung surgeries which she continued working through. But then one day in 2015, she reached a point where she could physically not get out of bed. She slid to the floor in tears. She knew God was telling her it was time to stop working.

After retiring, she struggled with feeling like she was not able to be useful to God any longer. Her physical and mental pain became intolerable, so she started using marijuana. This use became habitual after a while. Her spiritual journey basically came to a halt. She stopped attending church, reading the Bible, and having fellowship with other believers. The church fire happened and then COVID which further kept her away. Then in April of 2020, she developed a severe infection that required emergency surgery. She started out at Parma Hospital, but then a frantic, life flight ambulance ride took her to the main campus of Metro Hospital. She was awake and afraid. And she was all alone. This made her realize that it was just her and Jesus and that she was really sick. While she was waiting for the operating room to open up, she started praying and His presence once again came to Alice. She says, "It was warm. We were reacquainting. I was asking for forgiveness." The next thing she remembers was waking up with a nurse holding her hand and asking if her tears were because she was afraid. Alice answered her, "No. He is with me always." Since that time, she has been eager to be with Him daily, and to commune with her brothers and sisters in Christ here at St. Matthew's again.

We have been benefiting much by having Alice back home with us. She is always warm and friendly and encouraging to everyone she comes in contact with. Despite her physical limitations, she is always eager to help. And... the children love her!
