# ST. MATTHEW'S WOMEN'S TRIP TO MONASTERY----submitted by Lisa Bowden

A couple of weeks ago on October 11, ten of us ladies over the age of 50 traveled to the Transfiguration Monastery in Ellwood, Pennsylvania for a day long retreat. We met at the church a little before 7 a.m. and traveled in 3 cars. It only took us about an hour and 45 minutes and the drive was lovely as the leaves were starting to turn fall colors.

When we arrived, we were lovingly welcomed by the sisters and attended Divine Liturgy. After Liturgy, we had a coffee time during which Mother Christophora gave us a talk. We were given a tour of the monastery and then was treated to a delicious and filling lunch during which Mother Christophora read to us about Confession from a book by Metropolitan Kallistos Ware.

After the meal, we saw a video about Mother Alexandra (Princess Illeana of Romania) who founded the monastery.

After all this, we were welcome to walk around and enjoy the spacious and beautiful grounds. Some of the ladies chose to walk down to the cemetery (where Fr. Tom Hopko is buried). We were also able to shop at their bookstore.

We left around 2:45 p.m. and arrived back at the church around 4:30. It was a wonderful day! Below are some of the favorite parts of the trip:

"I enjoyed this trip a lot since It had been a while since my last trip to this monastery. Since the monastery was founded by Mother Alexandra, former Princess Ileana of Romania, I have a very strong connection

to it. I pretty much enjoyed every part of the pilgrimage and trip to the monastery, but especially the fellowship of the ladies, the lecture at lunch time and the beautiful grounds." - Florentina

"I had 2 favorite parts of the trip. One was spending time with my traveling companions. It is very rare to get that kind of quality time with busy women. Riding a total of 3 hours or so to and from the Monastery was a great way to do that. My other favorite part was the sanctity of the space we were in and the people with whom we visited. I honestly felt as if the weight of the glory of God remained with me long after our visit - it is, over a week later, still with me." - Cindy

I was very moved by the two sisters who shared their journey to monasticism with us at lunch. Also, Mother Christophora's picture of how the nuns have grown together as a family over the years. - Tara

To visit a monastery is like taking a break from life in the hectic world. The first thing I notice is a feeling of peace and love. I especially enjoyed this visit because there was another group of women there visiting from Shreveport, Louisiana. There were about 10 young women in their 30's and 40's, all converts and all excited and living fully in their faith. They said that Orthodoxy is growing strongly in their state. Because there were two large groups of women there, I felt like Mother Christophora went all out to make our visit there interesting and of value to our spiritual lives. - Khourie Bonnie

I think my favorite things about our last trip to the monastery was the open discussion of current issues between the other guests and Mother Christophora, and the 2nd thing was the size of the guest list and the stories the nuns got to share about their path to monastic life. I usually go on feast days when there are hundreds of people present, and we never get a chance to do this type of discussions/sharing of information. - Electra

# ASK THE PRIEST

THIS SECTION OF THE NEWSLETTER IS FOR QUESTIONS TO FR. AND EW CONCERNING OUR ORTHODOX CHRISTIAN FAITH---ANYTHING YOU HAVE BEEN WONDERING ABOUT CONCERNING OUR BELIEFS. SUBMITTED QUESTIONS WILL BE ANSWERED EACH MONTH AS SPACE ALLOWS.

WHAT IS THE POSITION OF THE ORTHODOX FAITH ON RACIAL MATTERS AND INTER-RACIAL MARRIAGE? In a sense you could say that Orthodox Christianity has no position at all on racial matters. The reason I say this is that the Orthodox tradition recognizes only one race--the human race. As St. Paul said in his sermon in Athens, Greece in Acts. 17: 25-26--"He Himself gives to all men life and breath and everything. And He made-----

from one every nation of men to live on all the face of the earth." St. Paul he.e, and all Christian teaching, is clear---God made all of humanity from one, we share one common blood, we are all of one race. Differences of color, language, etc. are of minor significance compared to this huge fact. Therefore, any prejudice or discrimination on the basis of so-called "race" is considered wrong by the Church. There is no reason whatsoever why those of different "races" should not be part of the same parish. And the Church has no problem with "inter-racial" marriage. Our concern is that the marriage be a Christian marriage---the color of skin is not an issue.

# WHY SO MUCH EMPHASIS IN THE OLD TESTAMENT ON THERE BEING A CHOSEN PEOPLE SET ASIDE BY

It has everything to do with the later coming of Jesus Christ at the first Christmas. In order for God the Son to come to our world as a human being, preparations had to be made. There had to be a mother to bear Him, someone of great holiness and obedience to God. Our Orthodox Fathers state that one of the main reasons for the whole Old Testament history was to make possible someone like St. Mary who would be able to be the God-Bearer, the Theotokos, the Mother of God. Also, it was absolutely necessary that there be a people who finally, after thousands of years of getting to that point, firmly believed that there was only one God. If we believe in many gods (as did everyone except the Hebrews) then to say that God became man in Christ is no big deal---which god became man? What about all the other gods, etc.? But once we really believe there is only one God, to say then that one infinite God became a man is a pretty incredible statement--and, of course, that's the whole basis of Christianity. To have a people who were, with all their other failings, at least firmly monotheistic by the time of the first Christmas, was essential---therefore, all the efforts of God in the Old Testament to get the Chosen People to believe in Him alone and to keep them separate from the pagans around them.
